



Aura Vale Lake Park



Located north of Cardinia Reservoir, Aura Vale Lake plays a very important role in Melbourne's water supply. The lake forms part of a drainage system designed to channel run-off water from neighbouring properties and roads, and stop it entering the main reservoir. This system prevents polluted water from affecting the quality of our drinking water. Over the past years Aura Vale Lake Park has become a popular venue for boating activities including sailboarding and canoeing and for other small non-powered boats.

How to get there

Aura Vale Lake is located next to Cardinia Reservoir, along Wellington Road (Melway 126 D6).

Picnic areas

Comprising 67 hectares, Aura Vale Lake Park has diverse settings for recreation, from highly modified and developed areas to remnant bushland.

Henley Picnic Area

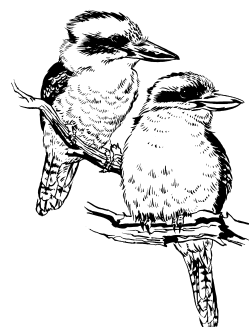
Located on the south side of Aura Vale Lake and accessed off Wellington Road, Henley Picnic Area has toilet facilities, car parking and open lawns for picnicking or relaxing in the sun. You may bring your own gas barbeque for use in the park, no solid fuel barbeques allowed, and all barbeques are banned on a day of total fire ban.

For people interested in watersports, Henley Picnic Area is the ideal location. Access to a boat launching ramp (non-motorised craft only) and areas for fishing make Henley Picnic Area a great family location.

Swimming is not permitted due to poor water quality and submerged objects.

Group picnics

Groups of fifty or more people need to notify the park office of their intended visit. You can contact the park via the Parks Victoria Information Centre on 13 1963.

Visitors with limited mobility

Visitors with limited mobility are welcome at Henley Picnic Area, which have accessible toilets. Please contact park staff if you require further information on access for people with limited mobility.

Fishing

Fishing is permitted in the lake; however consumption of fish is not advised.

A Recreational Fishing Licence (RFL) is required for all forms of recreational fishing in Victoria's water ways.

Park hours

The park is open to the public by 10.00am every day of the year. Closing times of park gates vary throughout the year.

Portable gas barbecues are allowed

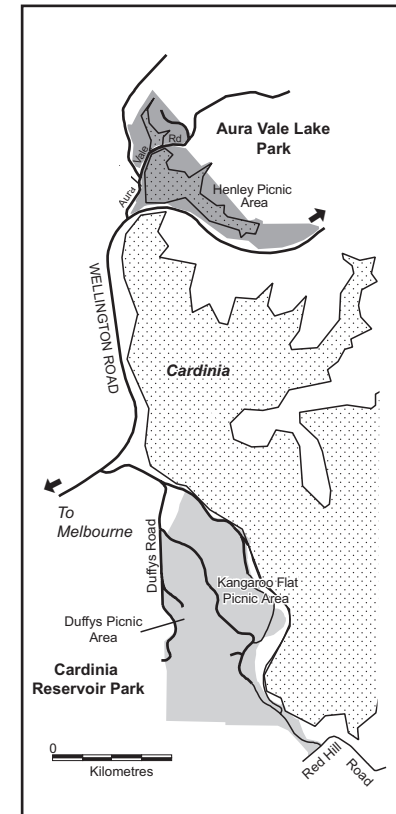
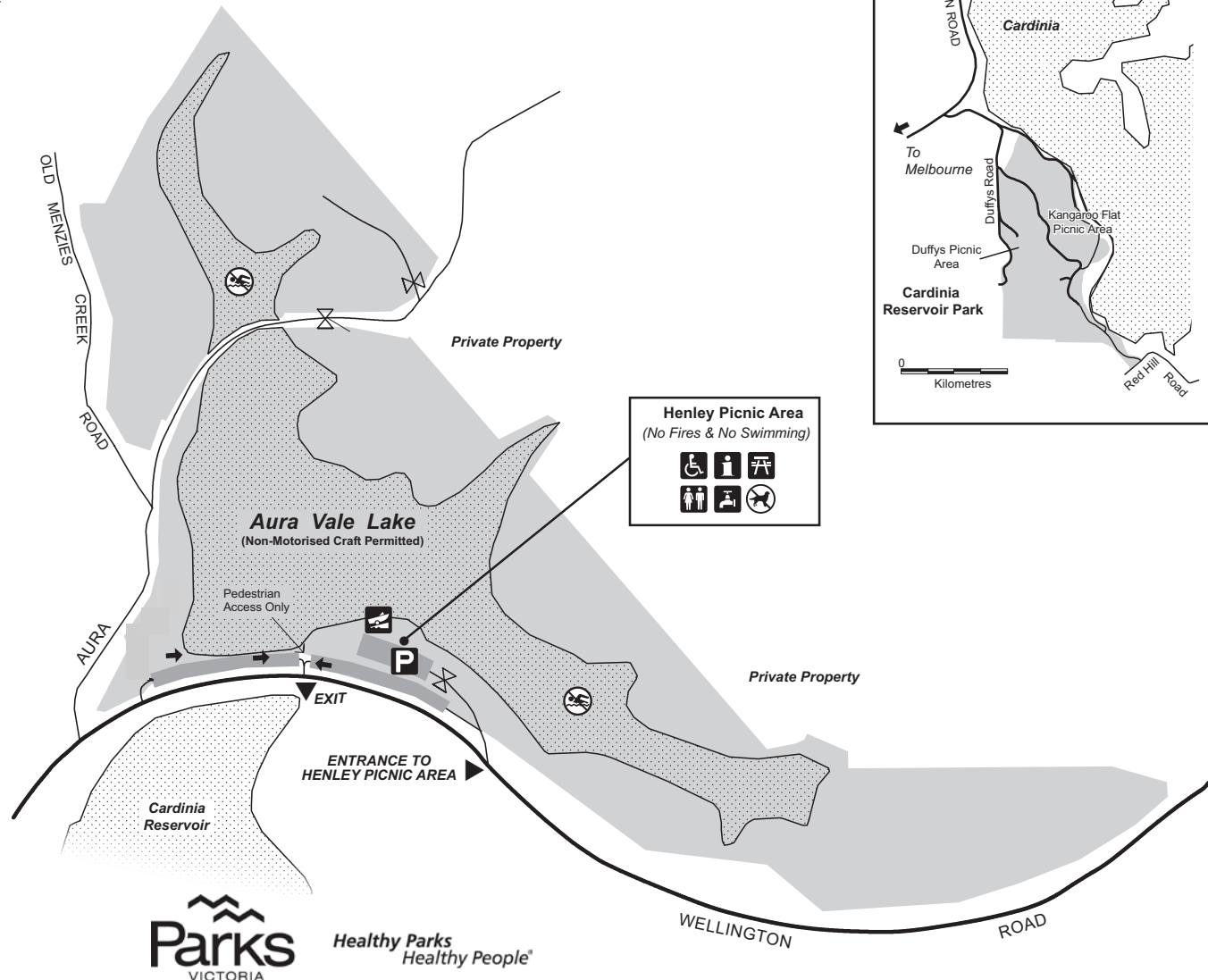
Dogs and other pets are not permitted in the park at any time
